SPRING INTO ACTION: MAKING YOUR SPRING PLAN A SEASONAL UPDATE FROM THE TALLMADGE ZONING DEPARTMENT

As you begin making various plans for the upcoming spring season, please keep these five reminders in mind to ensure everything remains compliant with City Code and to help keep Tallmadge a beautiful and safe place to live.

1. Check Before You Build. Most outdoor structures including fences, sheds, decks, and more require a Zoning Certificate before you begin work. Even if the County does not require a building permit, a Zoning Certificate is typically required.

2. The "24-Inch Rule" for Pools. Thinking of a pool for the kids? In Tallmadge, any pool capable of holding 24 inches of water or more (including storable or inflatable models) requires a Zoning Certificate and specific safety fencing requirements.

3. Know Your Property Lines. The City does not locate property pins. If you are planning to install anything on or near a property line, be sure to locate your survey pins or hire a professional surveyor to avoid any future issues.

4. Maintain Your Curb Appeal. As you're landscaping and refreshing your yard, remember that keeping Tallmadge beautiful is a team effort! City code requires grass and weeds to be regularly maintained. For properties with structures, please ensure grass is mowed within 150 feet of the road.

5. Guidelines for Your Sales. Planning a garage or yard sale? While a permit is not required, please remember that all signage must stay on private property. To maintain clear sightlines for drivers, signs are not permitted on utility poles or within the public right-of-way.

When in Doubt, Give Us a Shout!

To ensure your project goes off without any hiccups or interruptions, always check with the Zoning Department before you start. We are here to help you get it right the first time!

TYPES OF FINANCIAL SCAMS AND FRAUD

A MESSAGE FROM THE TALLMADGE POLICE DEPARTMENT DETECTIVE BUREAU

If the answer to any of the below questions is yes, you are likely being scammed, and DO NOT purchase Bitcoin.

- **IRS/Federal Agency Scam** – Is someone calling you claiming to be from the IRS, police, or federal agency claiming that you owe money and must pay with Bitcoin immediately?
- **Romance Scam** – Is a foreign boyfriend / girlfriend you met online asking you to send money?
- **Check Scam** – Has anyone mailed you a check and asked you to cash it?
- **Blackmail Scam** – Is anyone threatening you and requesting payment in Bitcoin?
- **Bill Pay Scam** – Has someone told you to pay your electric, IRS, or other bill, or that you have been overcharged and need a refund?
- **Jury Duty Scam** – Is someone claiming you missed jury duty and have a warrant out for your arrest?
- **Grandparent Scam** – Has your grandchild called you asking for bail money?
- **Unpaid Fines** – Has someone contacted you claiming you have unpaid fines from a speeding ticket?

If you fall victim to any scam that involves the buying and sending of crypto currency, please contact the Tallmadge Police Department Detective Bureau immediately at 330.633.4231. There is a possibility we can freeze your funds and potentially get them returned to you. Time is of the essence! The longer you wait, the less chance we have of recovering any funds.

Reminder: No government agency, bank, or otherwise will ever contact you and demand payment with crypto currency. If you find yourself standing before an ATM with someone on the phone telling you to send money to them, you are being scammed. You can always hang up the phone and contact us. We will be happy to verify.



FROM STREETLIGHTS TO DITCHES: YOUR GUIDE TO KEEP TALLMADGE MOVING FORWARD

Streetlight Out? The City of Tallmadge does not replace or repair streetlights. When a light is out or damaged in your neighborhood, contact FirstEnergy at 1.800.633.4766 or report a lighting problem online at firstenergycorp.com. In your report, include the address and/or the location of the pole, the pole number if possible, and if the light is burned out or intermittently working.

Street Trees Growing Into the Street and/or Sidewalk?

Homeowners are responsible for ensuring that trees in the public right of way are trimmed. Section 1361.02 (d) of the Tallmadge Codified Ordinances regulates those trees with branches overhanging streets and/or sidewalks must have a clear height of ten (10) feet above the surface of the sidewalk or fourteen (14) feet above the surface of the roadway.

Culvert Need Replaced? If a culvert pipe under a driveway apron needs to be replaced, contact the Street Department at 330.633.5130. A team member will determine the materials required and provide a quote for the replacement.

Ditch Not Flowing Properly? This could be due to overgrowth, silt build up, or a plugged or collapsed culvert pipe. Contact the Street Department at 330.633.5130 for more information.

REFUND & CANCELLATION POLICY

If a program is canceled by the City, we will issue a full refund or credit for the amount paid. Refund requests for other reasons must be submitted in writing to the Superintendent and must include the reason for the request. Requests will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis and cancellation fees may be assessed per the Recreation Pricing Grid. Fees may be waived for extenuating circumstances.



UNDERSTANDING THE LEVY: FINANCIAL FORECAST AND PLANNING AHEAD

TCS OUTLINES POTENTIAL CUTS AS FINANCIAL FORECAST SHOWS DEFICIT AHEAD

The Tallmadge City Schools Board of Education held a work session on February 11 focused on the district’s required state financial forecast and the cost-reduction options under discussion for the 2026–27 school year if new revenue is not approved. Superintendent Steve Wood and Treasurer Jeff Hostetler explained that each February, Ohio districts must submit a multi-year forecast that projects revenues and expenses and shows whether the district will maintain a positive cash balance through the state’s required timeframe. “A school district cannot go into the negative,” Wood said, describing the purpose of the forecast as identifying when the district would “run out of money” and what steps must be taken to prevent that.

Hostetler presented an interactive forecast model and said the district’s current projections show an ending balance of about \$1.44 million in fiscal year 2026 (ending June 30, 2026), followed by a deficit beginning in fiscal year 2027 if the district does not generate additional revenue. Hostetler emphasized that the state requires districts to show a plan that results in a positive balance by the third year of the forecast window. “Our goal is to get to a positive balance in fiscal year 28,” he said.

Both administrators repeatedly returned to what they described as a long-running structural problem: revenues are flat or declining while costs rise. Hostetler referenced House Bill 920’s impact on property tax growth and said rising local valuation reduces the district’s “state share,” lowering state aid. Wood added that even getting “barely even” by fiscal year 2028 requires assumptions that are difficult to sustain long-term.

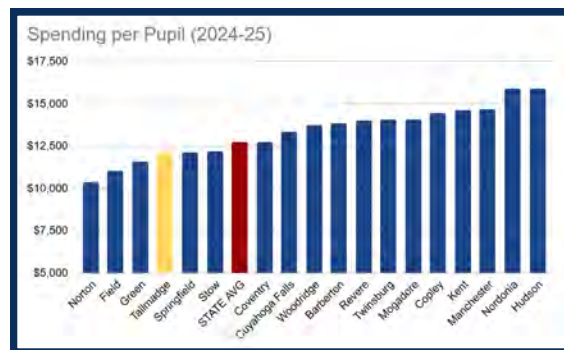

BUILDING USAGE

The district has always viewed its buildings as an extension of the community and has taken pride in allowing local groups to use the facilities in the evenings and on weekends. However, this access comes with real costs, including custodial overtime and increased utility expenses. As part of ongoing financial planning, the district may need to consider implementing fees for evening and weekend use or limiting access altogether.

This moment is the result of several years of financial pressure building, at the same time, rising costs, reduced state support, and limited flexibility to increase local revenue. The district has worked to stretch every dollar by consolidating buildings, reducing staff through attrition, and carefully managing spending, but the gap between revenue and expenses has continued to grow. These challenges have led to the difficult conversations now taking place as the district plans for the future and looks to the community for support.



Tallmadge continues to be one of the lowest per-pupil spending districts in Summit County.
